Linkers work closely with people with disability.



Linkers can also work with your family, carers and community.



Linkers can support you to fulfil your goals.



Linkers provide information to assist you to make decisions about how you live your life.



Linkers know a lot about the local community. They help you to find and use services, and do the things you want to do.



Linkers help you get involved in:

- activities you want to do
- sport
- education
- work or volunteering.



Linkers work with the community to make sure that services, activities and events are welcoming and inclusive.

Linkers work with all people and communities, including:

- people with disability
- Aboriginal people
- people from different backgrounds and cultures.



You can talk to a Linker whenever you need to. And you can talk to a Linker in a way that suits you.

Ability Links NSW is for:

- people from 7 to 64 years
- the families and carers of people with disability.



No assessment or diagnosis is needed.
